Key Note Speakers



In his presentation, professor **Alf Rehn** argues against overly rosy representations of our current state of innovation. Rather than presenting more buzzwords or slogans, he argues that innovation is in fact in a crisis both in society and our organizations. But all is not lost. By changing our way of speaking about it, reclaiming innovation ambition, and elevating our creative cultures, we can help in saving innovation.



Pär Johansson is Vice President of Innovation at LTU Business AB. He is also Director of the Technology Transfer Office of Luleå University of technology and is an expert in the development of commercialization strategies for technologies, companies and regional innovation ecosystems. As an commercialization strategist and innovation management expert, he regularly speak to groups of executives, director and senior administrators on the topic of innovation management.



Kristiina Jokelainen is leading the implementation of Smart Specialization and regional clusters development at the Regional Council of Lapland. She is also involved in the EC communication and interregional collaboration. She has gained expertise in the development of the strategic management processes, overall project cycle management and models development.
